
July Demonstration
Surface Embellishments
Jack Besperka



Jack Besperka talked about several types of surface embellishments that you may want to try. The various techniques included creating lines and burning them with formica or wire. To create evenly spaced lines use a hack-saw or drywall blade. In texturing and



coloring his pieces he uses black automotive enamel, shoe polish and wood bleach. He had various techniques for texturing with a dremel, an air impact hammer kit, wood bleach. After texturing he will sometimes and scrubs his pieces with a rough brush.

Several people asked Jack how he was able to keep the bleed of the burn or coloring off the remainder of the piece. He said that he keeps the part that is not going to be textured proud, or higher than the rest, then comes back and turns it down so the wood shows through. He also occasionally masks, the piece.

Editor's "Turn"

Sometimes I have a hard time getting motivated to do something. This past month, I finished up a project that has been going on for 7 years. Now that is procrastination that most people cannot beat!

The project was publishing a collection of my father's writings.

I attended a new group (new to me) called The Writer's League of Texas that a friend recommended to me. The four-person panel was discussing independent publishing.

I walked away from the meeting absolutely inspired. One of the reasons the book project was on the back, back, way-back burner was my fear of rejection at getting a publisher to accept it. I had a million questions, and didn't even know where to start.

I came home, dusted off the MicroSoft Word file and began putting it into some software that afforded easier editing. Wow, I'd been using the wrong software all along.

Then I found some tools on line that the panel had suggested to help bring the file into book format for printing.

All I can say is Jeff Bezos of Amazon has tapped into an entirely untouched market. Within 3 weeks the book was finished and published. Oh yeah, it's called *Rural Genius: Thoughts of the Day*.

Lesson . . . use the right tool and it all goes faster.

So, what does this have to do with my love of woodturning, or something you might actually be interested in? Well, think about it. How many times have you seen something either in our own member's gallery, or in a magazine and said to yourself, "I'd love to do that."

Then, months go by and you still haven't "done that."

I know it's happened to me. That old fear of failure. Or worse, I try it and it either blows up, or looks like an Edsel rather than the beautiful creation I imagined.

Then the trap of, "If I only had THAT tool, I could do it."

Trust me, the vendors at SWAT are all

dying for you to say just that. They're more than happy to sell you a new tool.

I have a gazillion tools that I either need to sell or donate. After years and years of turning, I've found I really only use about 15 tools. 3 bowl gouges of differing widths, 2 spindle gouges/ different widths, a skew, beading and parting tool, 3 parting tools (diamond parting tool, thin parting tool and really thin parting tool) and Cindy Drozda's scraper and Vortex tool. The EasyWood hollowing tools that I share with Steve.

Other tools that are helpful but are really more of a luxury: I have a roughing gouge (that I use when I'm turning big clunky things) and a bedan.

I bought Cindy's tool inserts for my skew, bowl gouge and spindle gouges. That's saved a lot of money, because I can turn the handle out of cheap wood, then use the handle for multiple purposes.

I'll never buy a tool with handle attached again. Using these inserts results in a lighter, more functional tool handle.

I bought some nice verneer calipers, bowl calipers, Two chucks (small and large)—but that's really a luxury. Oh, yeah, and a lathe.

The non-expensive tools are my angle grinder, my mallet and of course face shield and protective goggles. Ok the goggles were expensive because I decided to get my vision prescription in them. And a pin vise.

The other 25 tools I don't use, all those tools just sit there collecting sawdust.

I'm more productive and a better turner because I pared down the choices of tools to the ones that work for me.

The lesson here . . . if you are reluctant to show your work in the gallery, don't be. If you are reluctant to explore what works for other people, don't be. First Saturday's are great for experimenting with new tools.

Pat mentioned Vaden Mohrmann's cute "bear" beads of courage box. Now think about it, he started turning relatively recently! Yay Vaden!

Whether it's publishing your book, or turning a beautiful piece of art, more than likely the thing that's holding you back is really right in front of you—

you can see it when you look in the mirror.

Business Meeting

Pat Little opened the meeting by thanking Jay Littlefield for filling in for her in June. She then asked for visitors. **Adam Clark** from Cedar park is a new member.


