Wow! It is October already and my term as President for the CTWA is nearly over. Where has the year gone? When I took office, back in January, I had big plans to make all kinds of improvements to the way we do business as a turning club and I think I made some changes. but there are other things that I did not get to. However, I know that as of January 2017, I'll be leaving the club in the hands of a very capable leader in Vaden

Mohrmann.

Major Projects

Some projects left unfinished are huge and must span from my presidency to the next. Such as:

Updating the A/V equipment and bring us into the modern era of High Def. Len Brissette is chairing a committee to investigate what needs to

be done and come up with a budget and plan to acquire the necessary equipment. He will be joined by Greg Vest, Hilda Carpenter, Vaden Mohrmann and Jim Spano in this endeavor. What I've asked them to do is present to the membership a breakdown of the equipment needed and a cost analysis/budget for your approval.

I've also asked for a committee of members to look at the pros and cons of turning our club into a 501(c)3 charitable organization. However, there are Pros and Cons to doing this: On the positive side, we get tax breaks for club purchases and donations to the club give tax breaks to those who donate. We can receive donations of equipment from other 501(c)3 organizations.

On the flip side, there is the initial paperwork to establish ourselves as a 501(c)3 but it turns out the yearly tax filings are pretty simple. In addition, if, for whatever reason, our club disbands our assets must be donated to another 501(c)3 organization. Of course, I'm greatly simplifying a most complex process. Therefore, I've asked Pat Jenkins to head up a committee to review all our options and prepare a presentation to the membership for your consideration. Helping him in this endeavor will be Ed Roberts, Vaden Mohrmann, Lowell Williams and Pat Little.

Nominations for Board and Committee Membership

In October we take nominations for various Board and Committee chairmanships positions. We currently have a couple of Board positions that NEED to be filled.

President Elect: First, the position of President Elect must be filled with a capable person that will lead us for three years. First as President Elect, then as President and finish off as our SWAT representative. A three year

commitment that is both busy and rewarding.

Treasurer: Ed Roberts is and has been a real "treasure" to the CTWA and we are sorry to see him kick off his boots and hang up his hat as treasurer for this club. That means we need someone to man the fiscal responsibilities for the club.

National Demonstrator

We've selected **Kirk DeHeer**, a full time woodturner/artisan, to be our National Demonstrator this year. Which means: Our November meeting has been moved to Saturday, November 12th, where after the business meeting is complete we'll have Kirk DeHeer demonstrate the creation of his "Search for Diablo" plate using the latest turning, texturing and coloring techniques.

On Sunday, November 13th, a group of 6 to 8 members will meet with Kirk


Craig Timmerman demonstrated unique bowl turning for offset bowls. CTWA thanks Craig for his expertise and skills showing how to perform this method.

Meeting Location
