Demonstration John Lovelady Sea Urchin Ornaments

John Lovelady proficiently met the challenge of demonstrating without a lathe. Here are notes from **Charlie** Kay about the demonstration: How to Turn a Sea-Urchin Christmas Ornament - A Demonstration in Mime

I should preface this little piece by saying that I am trying to make up for my failure to completely carry out my assignments as a substitute meeting photographer for Drew Shelton and occasional note taker for our esteemed editor. At least Steve Green was there to take the notes this time. I may still get fired from both jobs anyway.

I got at least part of my assignment from Drew handled; I got all of the Show and Tell and Bring Back pieces photographed. However, as those of you who attended the meeting know, we once again were without a key to the lathe room and thus without a lathe and our audio-visual set-up. So the meeting proceeded through the business meeting, judging of the President's Challenge, and Show and Tell.

It was time for the demonstration, but with no lathe, how was that to happen? Our intrepid demonstrator, John Lovelady, had come prepared with everything he needed to do a fine demonstration, so he proceeded to do exactly that. He showed us examples of finished pieces, showed how to prepare the sea urchin shells, including filling them with styrofoam insulation. When asked why he did that, he simply dropped the prepared and filled shell onto the concrete floor from shoulder level. He then bent over and picked up the unbroken shell and said, "That's why!" He showed us his previously prepared blanks, fastened them into his chuck, and with the chuck in

one hand and his chisel in the other, he walked us through the whole process. As I watched, I was really impressed with how effective the demonstration was.

As we proceeded through the Bring Back ritual, it occurred to me that I had missed a photographic scoop - the first successful turning demo done without a lathe. So, my apologies to John for failing to capture for posterity his ingenious demonstration in photos, to Drew for failing to complete my assignment, and to Hilda for failing to document the entire meeting as I should have.

SWAT Update from Steve Green

Agenda and Rotation Schedule:

Want to get a jump on planning your time at the SWAT Symposium, the front page of the website for the South West Association of Turns contain a couple of links to both the Agenda and the Rotation Schedule.

Registration Window:

- If you're going to Waco on Thursday, August 24th, you will be able to collect your registration package from 3:00 to 6:00 PM. Don't ask before 3:00 or they'll snarl at you.
- On Friday, the registration window will open at 8:00 AM.
- The Registration office is WAY offlimits. If you don't have any business in there don't try to enter.

Raffle Ticket Sales:

- Want to buy raffle tickets? There will be a window at the registration area for buying tickets. The tickets will be pre-bundled into popular denominations. You can still buy odd lots of tickets but again, they might snarl at you.
