

STANDARD BY-LAWS OF THE CENTRAL TEXAS WOODTURNERS ASSOCIATION  
A NON-PROFIT CORPORATION

AS REVISED AND APPROVED BY A VOTE OF THE MEMBERSHIP AT A  
REGULARLY SCHEDULED MEETING OF THE CENTRAL TEXAS  
WOODTURNERS ASSOCIATION ON NOVEMBER 16, 1993, AND AMENDED ON  
AUGUST 21, 2001 AND AGAIN ON MARCH 18, 2003.

ARTICLE I - ORGANIZERS AND LOCATION

The Chapter organizer is S. Gary Roberts, 8613 Honeysuckle Trail, Austin, Texas,  
78759. Daytime telephone is 512.345.1521. Members are expected to be from  
Austin, Texas and the local surrounding cities and towns.

ARTICLE II - OFFICES

The principle office of this Chapter will be the address of the sitting president.

ARTICLE III - RELATION OF CHAPTER TO THE CORPORATE ORGANIZATION

All members of the Central Texas Woodturners Association agree to be members  
in good standing of the American Association of Woodturners, Inc.

While it is understood that the parent organization will provide advice and  
counsel, as requested, Chapters are advised that the nature and extent of their  
activities are left to their discretion. Demonstrations, while probably part of the  
normal activities of Chapters are to be conducted solely at the discretion of the  
officers, and all safety and instructions are to be under their explicit direction  
and control.

ARTICLE IV - PURPOSE

The Chapter's purposes, in addition to supporting the general purposes of the  
parent organization, are to provide a meeting place for local woodturners, share  
ideas and techniques regarding this craft, trade woods and exchange ideas about  
tools.

ARTICLE V - MEMBERSHIP FEES

Annual membership fees for this Chapter will include membership in the AAW  
and are subject to change by the Board of Directors as necessary and approved  
by membership vote.

ARTICLE VI - MEETINGS

This Chapter will meet the third Tuesday of each month at 7:00 PM. The  
meetings will be held at a place to be designated and listed in the monthly  
newsletter.

ARTICLE VII - OFFICERS

Number and Election. The officers of this Chapter will be President, President  
Elect, Secretary, Program Chairman and Treasurer. The Board of Directors will  
include all of the above named officers and will also include the two immediate

past presidents. All past presidents will be honorary members, and will be called upon for special advisory situations. These officers shall be elected annually by a majority vote of the Chapter's paid-up members. Such other officers and assistant officers as may be deemed necessary may be elected by the Chapter or appointed by the elected officers.

Term of Office. Each officer shall hold office for a term of two years beginning January 1, following the election.

Removal and Replacement. Any officer elected or appointed may be removed or replaced when it is deemed to be in the best interests of the Chapter. Removal or replacement will be accomplished by a majority vote of the Chapter's paid members who are present at the time of the vote, providing at least 25 per cent of the paid members are present.

Vacancies. A vacancy in any office because of death, resignation, removal, disqualification or otherwise may be filled for the unexpired portion of the term by a majority vote of the members or of the officers.

President. The President shall be the principal executive officer of the Chapter. The President shall conduct meetings, supervise and control all business and affairs of the Chapter.

President Elect. In the absence of the President or in the event of his death, inability, or refusal to act, the President Elect shall perform the duties of President and when so acting, shall have all the powers of and be subject to all the restrictions upon the President. The President Elect shall perform such duties as from time to time may be assigned by the President.

Program Chairman. The Program Chairman shall have the responsibility for arranging for the monthly meeting program.

Secretary. The Secretary shall record the minutes of Chapter business meetings in the monthly newsletter and keep a permanent file of those newsletters. In general, the Secretary shall perform all duties incident to the office of Secretary and such other duties as, from time to time, may be assigned by the President.

Treasurer. The Treasurer shall collect all membership fees and all other monies belonging to the Chapter. The Treasurer will be responsible for keeping current and accurate records of all monies that flow through the Chapter and also for ensuring that all local Chapter members are current paid-up members of the National Organization. In general, the Treasurer shall perform all of the duties incident to the office of Treasurer and such other duties as from time to time may be assigned by the President

#### ARTICLE VIII ñ INDEBTEDNESS

The American Association of Woodturners must be notified in writing prior to the Chapter incurring any indebtedness for the American Association of Woodturners.

ARTICLE IX - AMERICAN ASSOCIATION OF WOODTURNERS DISCLAIMERS  
FISCAL AND LEGAL

The American Association of Woodturners, inc., specifically disassociates itself from any debts, obligations or encumbrances of the Chapter. The Corporate Board of Directors of the American Association of Woodturners is not responsible for the debts nor shares in the profits of the Chapter.

The Corporate Organization does not shoulder any legal liability for accidents that occur during events of any kind sponsored or unsponsored by the Chapter.

ARTICLE X - AMENDMENTS

These By-Laws may be altered, amended or repealed and new By-Laws may be adopted by a vote of a simple majority of the qualified, voting members of the Chapter then casting ballots. Copies of all modifications of these By-Laws must be filed with the National Office of the American Association of Woodturners.

ARTICLE XI ñ CENTRAL TEXAS WOODTURNERS ASSOCIATION DISCLAIMERS
