
- 1. It doesn't need to be big or fancy.








Demo Steps

Step 1 sand to at least 400 grit

Step 2. Clean piece with DNA

Step 3. D-nub with scotch brite pad

Step 4. Apply 1/2 & 1/2 (sanding/DNA)

Step 5. D-nub again

Step 6. Apply liberal amount of sanding paste rubbing it in by hand with paper towel. Start lathe out slow rubbing the paste against the wood, as the paste starts coming off

Use clean areas of the towel gradually sped up the lathe to 750-1000 rpms. When nothing is showing on the towel go to next step.

Step 7. Either use the friction polish ie. OB Shiner Juice; Frenchie's polish or polishing paste. (OB/ Frenchie) Again rub onto the wood with cotton cloth start lathe slow, gradually speed up applying pressure. The heat builds up the shine, continue to add more coats for better shine, minimum would be 3 coats.

It you want a more satin shine and food safe use the polishing paste. Apply liberal amount with a cotton cloth, let sit 15-20 mins, buff with clean dry cotton cloth, medium to light pressure, apply at least 3 coats. Your bowls can be rejuvenated with a light coat of the polish.

Abrasive Paste

400g Mineral Oil. 2.00 50g White Beeswax. 1.50 40g Yellow Beeswax. 1.00 10g Carnauba Wax. .60 100g fff Pumice 3.20 Total. \$8.30 = 20oz or .42 per oz. EEE Ultra Shine \$24.95 2 oz Yorkshire Grit \$17.65 8oz

Polishing Paste

400g Mineral Oil. 2.00 50g. Orange Oil. 1.80 50g White Beeswax. 1.50 50g Carnauba Wax. 3.00 100g Yellow Beeswax. 2.50 Total. \$10.80 = 24oz or .45 per oz Renaissance Wax \$29.99 7oz Howard's \$8.99 16 oz

Friction Polish. Aka OB Shine Juice

4 oz Boiled Linseed Oil. 1.04. 32oz 8.37 4 oz Zinsser Clear Shellac 1.87. 32oz 14.97 4 oz DNA .53. 128oz.16.27 Total. \$3.44 = 12oz or .29 per oz

Frenchie's Polish

3.6 oz Boiled Linseed Oil .94 7.2 oz Zinsser Clear Shellac. 3.37 1.2 oz DNA. .15 Total. \$4.46 = 12 oz or .37 per oz Huts \$12.95 6 oz Shellawax \$32.95 8.5 oz Mylands \$17.95 8 oz
