
CTWA 2024 Demonstration Schedule



Demo Topic: Offset wood Turning Jigs

If any of you have attended the Worldwide Woodturners zoom meeting on Wednesday nights you would be familiar with a shop made jig, we named the Duxbury Offset Jig, Jim Duxbury has shared in the Woodturning Magazine. By removing two of the jaws from a chuck to assist in clamping a wood cinching type jig as seen in pictures below. May turn the duck on it.

The last couple of months I've also been turning with the Ruth Niles Journey Offset Pendant Jig. The turning results are many possibilities for abstract type pendants. 


Demo Topic: Offset wood Turning Jigs




