Rising contributor I suggest that you check first before trying to apply lacquer while a wooden turned form is being supported by a vacuum chuck. Depending on what species of wood you are using, it is absolutely possible to pull finish right through the wood while under vacuum - I have done it! If you are not aware that this can happen, you can continue to apply finish and have it sucked through the chuck, through your tubing, and into the vacuum pump. You may need to re-think this, and certainly check it out before going ahead with applying finish while under vacuum. Just a WARNING from personal experience!!

Rob Wallace I've never had it happen. But I have two filters in the suction line just in case. I usually have the bottoms well sealed before spraying.
